

Quick Fix

Something you can do right now

Reduce your water heater's temperature

Lowering your water heater's temperature from 140°F to 120°F can reduce water heating costs by up to 10%. This temperature will also help prevent scalding.

Check the owner's manual for safety instructions before making any changes to your water heater's settings.

After lowering the temperature on the water heater, use a thermometer to check the temperature of water flowing from your faucets.

An affordable way to save more

Check your air filters every month

You can improve the energy efficiency of your heating and cooling systems and improve your indoor air quality by checking your filters monthly.

First, remove the filter — it usually slides right out. Next, hold the filter up to a light to see if it is clogged.

You can find an inexpensive replacement for a clogged disposable filter at your local hardware store. Check your manual for cleaning instructions if you have a permanent filter.
